The Activity Based Costing (ABC) represents a new model in management accounting. In recent decades, it has been the subject of several research papers, especially in developed countries (USA, UK, and France). However, this type of works is still absent in the Arab countries. In this context, this article highlights the results of an empirical study on the relationship between information technology, knowledge sharing, total quality management and organizational performance. The questionnaires were completed by CFOs, management controllers, accountants and managers. The results using correlation analysis indicate that knowledge sharing, and total quality management do have a significant relationship on the organizational performance. Also, we found that information technology is not significantly correlate with organizational performance.

Question 2

THE FACTORS IMPACTING STUDENTS' INTENTION TO EFFECTIVELY USE E-LEARNING METHOD IN A VIRTUAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Abstract

In the recent pandemic period, the education sector was heavily impacted. Schools and higher learning institutions have had to make immediate and drastic transformation from face-to-face teaching and learning to online teaching and learning in a virtual learning environment. As a result, educators and students alike have had to adjust their teaching and learning approaches. Particularly for the students, this has involved overcoming the challenges of learning in isolation and devising quick coping strategies for effective learning. On the other hand, online learning in the virtual environment has given them the advantage of attending classes from home, wherever they are - be it within the same country as the institution they are registered with, or from abroad. Despite the advantage of logistics, the challenge of learning in isolation without instructor and peer support remains real. This challenge must be addressed as the world progresses into making education accessible to anyone, everyone and anywhere. This study aims to identify the factors such as self-regulation, students' isolation, learning environment and learning resources that impact on students' intention to effectively use online learning and student engagement as a moderator between self-

regulation and students' intention to effectively use online learning. Besides, Respondents for this study consist of students in a private university. This study employs a quantitative method. A set of questionnaire surveys was administered online with a return of 367 respondents. The research data was analyzed using SPSS. The findings gathered indicate that self-regulation, students' isolation and learning resources significantly impact their intention to effectively use e-learning methods. Meanwhile, the impact of a learning environment is not significant intention to effectively use e-learning and student engagement is moderator. In this study, it is evident that online learning requires students to be highly motivated and disciplined, as well as proactive through self-directed learning.
