THE FURNISHED ROOM

A weary young man wanders the redbrick district of New York's lower West Side in search of a furnished room—and, more urgently, in search of Eloise Vashner, a young actress who disappeared months ago. After knocking on many doors, **he** arrives at a shabby house where a housekeeper offers him the third-floor back room. She tells him it has been recently vacated and once occupied by many stage performers, but she does 5 not recall anyone named Eloise. He rents the room, hopeful and desperate.

Once inside, he is overwhelmed by the dreary furnishings and ghostlike traces of past tenants. Despite the stale and musty atmosphere, he suddenly detects the sweet scent of mignonette—Eloise's favourite perfume. Convinced **she** had once stayed there, he frantically searches for a sign: a hairpin, a note, anything. But all he finds are 10 meaningless leftovers from strangers. The room seems haunted, not just by its past, but by the aching memory of a love lost.

- Driven by this scent that seems to summon her very spirit, he speaks to her aloud and searches the room again, more obsessively. But the scent vanishes, and reality slowly replaces hope. He finds no tangible evidence of her presence and begins to believe that 15 even this faint sign was an illusion. Still gripped by despair, he rushes to question the housekeeper again.
- The housekeeper insists the last tenant was a woman named Miss Sprowls, short and dark-haired—nothing like the fair Eloise. Before **her**, others stayed, none matching Eloise's description. With his final glimmer of hope extinguished, the young man returns 20 to the now lifeless room. The perfume is gone. The truth settles in. In silent surrender, he seals the room, turns on the gas, and lies on the bed, choosing to die in the room he believes once held the love of his life.
- V Meanwhile, downstairs, the landlady Mrs. Purdy chats with her friend Mrs. McCool,

casually revealing over drinks that she had rented the same room a week after a girl 25 committed suicide in it. When asked whether she told the new tenant, she replies that business is business—rooms are for renting. She adds that the girl had a mole near her left eyebrow—a final, tragic confirmation that Eloise had indeed been there, and that the man unknowingly took his life in the very place where she had taken hers.
