Question 1

SE Innovation is a company that specialises in interior design solutions and custom-built furnishings, operating in Tasek Industrial Park. Due to the increasing demand for personalised and functional interior spaces, the company has experienced a significant surge in project requests from both residential and commercial clients. In order to meet this growing demand, the company purchased a specialised piece of equipment on 31 May 2021 to enhance its production and design capabilities. Details of the cost incurred are as follows:

SE Innovation received a trade discount of 5% from the purchase price. The specialised equipment has an estimated useful life of ten years with no residual value and to be depreciated on a straight-line method, monthly basis. The company closes its accounts on 31 December each year.

On 31 October 2024, due to cost ineffective of maintaining the specialised equipment, the company sold the specialised equipment at RM250,500.

Additional information:

- 1. A physical count of inventories at the end of the financial year revealed inventory with a cost of RM15,000. However, inventory costing RM4,000 was damaged and it was estimated that it could be sold for RM3,000.
- Smart Cop Sdn Bhd, one of the customers has just been declared bankrupt by the court and the company has decided to write off its debts of RM12,000.
- 3. The allowance for doubtful debts is estimated to be 2% of the net trade receivables.
- 4. The insurance expense is for a 12-months fire insurance policy which was purchased on 1 April 2024 and paid in cash.
- 5. During the year, the owner took goods costing RM3,000 and cash RM1,000 from the business for his personal consumption .These have not been relflected in the books.
- 6. Depreciation expense for the property, plant and equipment is to be provided on a yearly basis as follows:

Building

2% on cost

Motor vehicle

5% on cost

Plant and machinery

20% on carrying amount

7. Only half a year's interest on the fixed deposit has been received by the business.

8. An electricity payment of RM1,200 was incorrectly debited to rental expenses.

9. On 1 October 2024, the company purchased a new machine costing RM50,000 paid by cheque. The following additional cost incurred in relation to the purchase:

i. Transportation cost RM2,000

ii. Installation cost RM1,500

iii. Training expenses RM800

iv. Repair cost due to damage during delivery RM1,200

No journal entry have been recorded for the above transaction.
