Discuss how Islam views the importance of Maqasid al-Shariah (al-ḍarūriyyah) in striving for justice, and explain—based on the Prophet’s saying, “Whoever does not concern himself with the affairs of other Muslims is not one of them”—how showing concern for the suffering of fellow Muslims reflects the true values of Ukhuwah Islamiyyah and Ihsan.
